Old Business

Progress to Date: Strategic Plan Outline

- A. Barr introduced the next iteration of the document outline
- Strategic themes will benefit from an "end statement" (describing desired outcome for the thematic area)
- Strategic action tables can be designed to provide staff with broad stroke directions
 - Staff are responsible for crafting operational plans to support the outcomes articulated in the strategic plan
- Consider an annual report approach to communicate progress (articulating successes, challenges, redirects, etc.)
- Working through past documents, there is a recognition that progress has been made (but no one knows about it)
- Staff need to be engaged before the outcomes are approved by Council
 - Staff will have vital information to ensure that the stated outcomes are viable
- It would be beneficial to share the outline with the CAO and have an informal discussion around what we hope to achieve
 - Conversation would include discussion about previous barriers
 - Staff perspective and buy-in are critical to our success

Motion: that the strategic plan draft outline be presented to Council as proof of concept for approval to proceed with public consultation for community and staff input

Process for Public Consultation (Request for Proposal)

- R. Giles provided an overview of a draft "request for proposal" to obtain third party expertise in the production of the strategic plan and collection of data
- A contract authority (Staff resource) should oversee the request for proposal and its logistics
- If willing volunteers are available to fulfill the requirements outlined in the RFP, third party expertise may not be required
 - It would be difficult to find dollars for a vendor (availability of grant money?)
 - It would be difficult to justify spending the money on a vendor
 - There is a distinction between a contributor and a facilitator (one cannot do both at the same time effectively)
 - Volunteers from within the community driving the process may unknowingly sway the discussion and input; an objective third party ensures that everyone's input is captured

- Council needs to know how much it costs to execute a strategic planning session and resulting document
- Draft RFP should be shared with staff and Council to provide them with a sense of the complexity of the work to be undertaken
- Downside to having this community driven is the passion that comes with its contents
- Downside to having a third party vendor is the cost
- If you don't have the resources to commit, don't do it
- Why do we need a Strategic Plan?
 - O Strategic plan gives a planned direction and response for issues
 - We already have a series of plans with foresight going forward multiple years (with reserves identified)
 - Strategic plan is not intended to replace operational plans that aid in the day-to-day realities of the municipality
 - o Strategic plan enables the community hope and dream of a different future
 - o Strategic plan directs Council and future Councils
