Village of Merrickville-Wolford

I have now had an opportunity to review the Consent Applications B128-20 and B129-20 as they relate to the Village of Merrickville Wolford Official Plan and Zoning By-law and provide the following comments.

The proposal involves the creation of two rural residential lots, ranging in size from 2.5 acres to 3 acre, with roughly 450 feet of frontage on County Road #43. The subject property is located on the southeast side of County Road #43 within 175 m of the Rideau River. The proposed lots are also within 225 metres of an active railway right-of-way.

The subject lands are designated Rural in the Merrickville Wolford Official Plan and Rural (RU) in the Merrickville Wolford Zoning By-law.

Section 3.7.1 (4) of the Official Plan discourages direct access onto a County Road for new lots. Section 5.2.1 indicates that where there is direct access onto a County Road that the local Council will require the issuance of an entrance permit prior to considering the application. This is not a matter of concern for the Village Council but is a matter that the application should address prior to the matter being considered by the United Counties Land Division Committee.

Section 3.18.1 of the Official Plan requires that development proposed within 300 m of a watercourse have an archeological survey be completed. This information has not been provided and it is recommended that consideration of the application be deferred until this supporting information is provided.

Section 3.22.1 of the Official Plan sets out the noise impact policies and identifies that a noise impact assessment may be requested by the Town when development is proposed within 500 metres of an active railway. The application of this policy is at the discretion of Council but I would recommend that a noise study be done given the fact that both parcels are within 500 meter of a Major Rail Line. Again it is recommended that consideration of the application be deferred until this supporting information is provided.

Other than the above noted matters, all other polices of the Official Plan appear to be satisfied.

The application appears to conform to the relevant policies of the Zoning By-law.

Given need for an Archeological Assessment and a Noise Impact Study, it is recommended that consideration of these consent applications be deferred until such time as the applicant has presented the necessary supporting information.

Question from Council: "Dealing with Speeding"

Good Afternoon Doug:

Tools used for monitoring and collecting information from areas of concern, has changed in recent years.

The former Speed Monitor Device Displayed the posted speed of a Street or Roadway, as a vehicle approaches the device from One Direction, it displays and recorders the higher speed the motorist is traveling (Time/Date/Speed)

This info is later downloaded and used to determine the best time/day to set up Radar and issue tickets or warnings depending speeds.

It is estimated,80% of vehicles slow down as they realize they are speeding, only to increase as they pass by.

The now used "Speed Spy", is a nondescript speed radar that mounts on any Hydro or Telephone Pole. It is a Grey Waterproof Box containing a Battery operated Radar System, does not have a display and is not detectable by the Public.

It can gather and record speeds from Two Directions of travel.

Recently, Speed Spy was used over a period of time to collect information to address a Public Concern regarding speeding along the 800 & 900 Blocks of St. Lawrence Street North and South. Information gathered by Speed Spy confirmed speeding was an issue and the most effective times to set up unmarked Police Vehicles with a Traffic Officer and Radar Gun, resulting in several Tickets and Warnings.

The issue of how best to address Speeding Concerns and Public Complaints were discussed with North Grenville Detachment Commander at a M-W Police Service Meeting, sometime ago. It was suggested these types of Concerns and Complaints should be made directly to OPP as a way of providing as much useful contact information as possible regarding location and times etc., so a Traffic Officer can be assigned,

OBJECTIVE:

To provide Council with information in order to authorize the

2021 Interim Borrowing By-law

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT: Council does hereby receive report FIN-01-2021 regarding the Interim Borrowing By-law for 2021; and

THAT: Council does hereby give favourable consideration to By-law 01-2020, being a by-law to authorize the borrowing of money to meet the 2021 expenditures of the Corporation of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford.

BACKGROUND:

Section 407 of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, authorizes a municipality to approve temporary borrowing to meet current expenditures in advance of the collection of tax revenue and budgeted revenues from other sources. From January 1 to September 30, the amount borrowed may not exceed 50% of the total estimated revenues. For the last quarter of the year, the limit is set at 25% of the total estimated revenues. Until the current year's budget is passed, the estimated limits are calculated using the estimated revenues as set out in the budget adopted the previous year.

It is standard practice for a municipality to adopt a by-law in January for this purpose.

ANALYSIS:

Each year at this time Council approves an interim borrowing by-law to meet the current expenditure needs in advance of collecting tax revenue and budgeted revenues from other sources for the upcoming year. Municipal cash balances are typically lower in the first few months of the year prior to the February tax deadline.

The total 2020 budgeted revenues were approximately \$5.1 million (excluding water and sewer revenues). The draft by-law attached to this report authorizes the Mayor and Treasurer to borrow up to \$2 million, which is below the prescribed limit. The municipality has not had to use interim borrowing in several years.

Staff do not anticipate the need for interim borrowing in 2021. Therefore, the passage of an Interim Borrowing By-law is a precautionary measure. Borrowing for capital projects is a separate process.

ONTARIO MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS - BORROWING BY-LAW

BEING a By-Law to authorize the Municipality to borrow up to \$2,000,000 during the January 1, 2021 to September 30, 2021 period and up to \$1,000,000 during the October 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021 period in order to finance the Village's Current Operating Expenditures on an interim basis;

WHEREAS Sections 407 (1) and (2) of the Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, authorize Council to pass a by-law authorizing the municipality to borrow from time to time by way of promissory note or bankers' acceptance such sums as Council considers necessary to meet the current expenditures of the Corporation for the year until the taxes are collected and other revenues are received, provided the amounts borrowed between January 1 and September 30 and between October 1 and December 31 of the year do not exceed fifty per cent (50%) and twenty five per cent (25%), respectively, of the total estimated revenues of the corporation as set forth in the budget adopted for the prior year;

AND WHEREAS the Council deems it necessary to authorize the borrowing together with any similar borrowings that have not been repaid, a maximum of \$2,000,000 during the period between January 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021, and a maximum of \$1,000,000 during the period between October 1, 2021, and December 31, 2021 in order to meet the current operating expenditures of the Corporation until the taxes are collected, such sums representing not more than fifty percent (50%) and twenty-five percent (25%), respectively, of the estimated revenue of the Corporation as set forth in the budget adopted for the prior year;

AND WHEREAS Council deems it expedient to pass a by-law for such purpose.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford does enact as follows:

- 1. The Mayor and Treasurer of the Corporation are hereby authorized under the seal of the Corporation, to borrow by way of promissory note or banker's acceptance a sum not exceeding \$2,000,000 between January 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021 and \$1,000,000 between October 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021 for the purpose of meeting the current operating expenditures of the Corporation until the taxes are collected.
- 2. Despite the provisions of Section 1 of this By-law, the amounts that may be borrowed during the times and for the purposes mentioned in Section 1 of this By-law, together with the total of any similar borrowings that have not been repaid, shall not, except with the approval of the Local Planning and Appeals Tribunal, exceed during the period between January 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021, and during the period between October 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021, fifty percent (50%) and twenty-five percent (25%), respectively, of the uncollected balance of the estimated revenues of the Corporation as set forth in the budget adopted for the prior year.
- 3. The Mayor and Treasurer are hereby authorized to pay or allow the bank or banks or any other person, firm or corporation that lends money to the Corporation, interest on the sums borrowed at such rates of interest and on such other terms as may be arranged by the Treasurer and adopted by Council.

- 4. The promissory note, or notes, debentures, covenants or agreements sealed with the seal of the Corporation and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Mayor and Treasurer may be given to the said bank or banks, person, firm or corporation as aforesaid as security for the repayment of the amounts borrowed with interest thereon as aforesaid.
- 5. This By-law shall come into force and take effect on January 1, 2021.

OBJECTIVE:

To provide Council with information in order to authorize the

Interim Tax Levy By-law for 2021.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT: Council receive report FIN-02-2021 regarding the Interim Tax Levy for 2021; and

THAT: Council does hereby give favourable consideration to 02-2021, being a bylaw to authorize the 2021 interim tax levy and due dates.

BACKGROUND:

The purpose of this report is to seek authorization from Council to impose an interim property tax levy for the 2021 taxation year. The interim tax levy is required to ensure cash flow in order to meet the financial obligations of the municipality prior to the final 2021 tax levy.

Section 317 of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, permits the municipality to impose upon all taxable property an interim tax levy not to exceed a prescribed percentage or 50% of the total taxes for municipal and school board purposes levied on a property for the previous year. The Act requires that an interim tax levy by-law be passed in the year to which it applies or in November or December of the previous year, provided that the by-law does not come into effect until a specified day in the applicable year.

ANALYSIS:

The proposed by-law authorizes the municipality to impose a portion of the tax levy based on 50% of the previous year's total tax levy on all tax classes within the Village in 2021. The levy is based on the total billing for the previous year and does not reflect the 2021 budget or tax rates. The by-law also sets the payment and penalty authority of the municipality. The interim tax due date will be February 26, 2021 for all properties.

BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:

The interim tax levy has a short-term financial effect in that it represents revenue requirements of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford prior to the final tax by-law applicable to the 2021 fiscal year only.

LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLANS:

On January 23, 2017, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford passed By-Law 10-17, being a by-law to adopt the Merrickville-Wolford Strategic Plan 2017-2025.

The priorities of the strategic plan that can be linked to this report are as follows:

Ensuring efficient, effective services and civic engagement

Through the passage of the proposed Interim Tax Levy By-law, the Village will be authorized to levy taxes on an interim basis to ensure tax revenue is collected in order to carry on providing services to the municipality.

CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF MERRICKVILLE - WOLFORD BY-LAW No. 02-2021

BEING a By-Law to impose an interim tax levy for the year 2021 on properties within all tax classes in the Village of Merrickville-Wolford.

WHEREAS pursuant to section 317 (1) of the Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, the council of a local municipality, prior to the adoption of the estimates for the year may pass a bylaw levying amounts on the assessment of property in the local municipality;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to section 317 (3) of the Municipal Act, S.O. 2001, the amount levied on a property shall not exceed a prescribed percentage, or 50% if no percentage is prescribed, of the total amount of taxes for municipal and school purposes levied on the property for the previous year;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to impose an interim tax levy on all properties within the Village of Merrickville - Wolford in order to cover interim expenditures;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Merrickville - Wolford does enact as follows that:

- 1. A 2021 interim tax levy be imposed on all property classes within the limits of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford.
- 2. The amount levied on all property classes in the Village of Merrickville-Wolford shall be equal to 50% of the total amount of taxes for municipal, county and school purposes levied on the property for the previous year, subject to any mandatory adjustment dictated by the legislation or by regulation.
- 3. The amount levied may be adjusted to include the levying of amounts on assessment added to the assessment roll in 2021 that was not on the assessment roll in 2020.
- 4. The said interim tax levy shall become due and payable on the 26th day of February 2021. Any unpaid balance outstanding on the 27th day of February, 2021 shall constitute default.
- 5. A penalty of 1.25% shall be added to all interim levy amounts that are in default on the 27th day of February 2021 and on the 1st day of each month thereafter until paid in full.
- 6. All penalties and interest added to the interim tax levy in default shall become due and payable as if the same had originally been imposed as part of the interim tax levy.
- 7. This By-Law shall be deemed to have been passed and in effect as of the 1st day of January, 2021.

RE: Year-end report for 2020

OBJECTIVE:

To provide Council with an update regarding the activities of the Merrickville Fire Department in 2020, for information purposes.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT: Council receives report FD-01-2021, being the 2020 year-end report of the Fire Department, for information purposes.

BACKGROUND:

In keeping with the Village's commitment of openness and transparency to Council and the public, it is deemed prudent to report updates and statistics to keep Council and the public informed of the progress of the Merrickville Fire Department (MFD).

ANALYSIS:

The MFD responded to approximately 98 calls for service in 2020. Seasonal and tourist activity traditionally provides an increase in call volume over the 2nd & 3rd quarters. The calls are primarily responses to medical assists (due to paramedics having to respond from Smiths Falls or Kemptville), motor vehicle collisions and fire/carbon monoxide alarms. This year has seen the call volume increase over last year, possibly due to more people being home during the pandemic. The Department has seen an increase to 98 calls over the previous year's total of 65 calls for emergency service. A summary of the calls received in 2020 is provided below.

The United Counties of Leeds and Grenville has initiated a Fire Service Review of all the Departments within Leeds and Grenville. The review is being done by Pomax Consulting and will look at the way all of the departments operate and will look for proficiencies, response times and ways to improve the fire services. The draft report is out now for review by Fire Chiefs and the steering committee and will then be presented to Counties Council.

The focus of the Merrickville Fire Department is the protection of all firefighters, citizens and visitors in Merrickville-Wolford. This is accomplished by the dedication and time committed to training and equipment maintenance/inspection by all members. Ensuring that the training program(s) for the firefighters is attainable, accessible and to a recognized provincial standard is critical to the level of service expected from the citizens we serve. The MFD has adopted the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Firefighter 1 & 2, 1001 Training Program and has been following this for the past 5 years. Training occurs every second Tuesday evening and vehicle/equipment checks, and drill nights occur on the opposite Tuesday nights for each of the three platoons over a two-month period. Training has been altered this year to provide a safe environment and more at home and virtual learning methods were implemented during the pandemic. In 2019 the Department hired 5 probationary recruits who have successfully attained their Firefighter 1 certification and have now become active members of the Fire service. The Fire Chief would like to congratulate them on their new positions. The Chief would also like to thank all members of the fire service for their dedication during this pandemic and for putting their community first.

FIREFIGHTER HOURS:

Total Training hours: 298 hours

Total Emergency Call hours: 1,274 hours

VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT:

The vehicle used by the Manager, Operations/Fire Chief has been outfitted with a full red and blue light and siren system, which has allowed the truck to be utilized to respond to emergencies. The vehicle is now known as Unit 1 and carries medical equipment and a defibrillator for first response. The Manager, Operations/Fire Chief has continued to improve the response time for emergency calls by 5 minutes or more in most cases allowing for faster medical care, and also to expedite the assessment of the scene and stage incoming apparatus as they arrive.

All fire trucks and equipment have gone through annual inspections and pump testing, Annual testing for all the self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) was also completed in 2020. The cascade and air quality systems passed testing. The new NFPA 1851 standard now states that all Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) must be inspected and serviced twice a year. The 10-year life span of this equipment is

monitored and replaced as required under the NFPA Standards. All Merrickville gear has been sent out for third party testing and inspection as well as professional cleaning.

The brush truck was changed over from the water pump skid unit to the truck cap with inside LED lighting for winter rural responses. The vehicle also underwent a new wiring harness to allow for the electric brakes on the new trailer purchased to haul the UTV to emergency scenes.

All small equipment including generators, pumps and scene lighting have been inspected and serviced in 2020 with all maintenance done in-house under the guidance of a certified mechanic. All fire apparatus was inspected and prepared for proper winter operation.

BURNING PERMITS

The Village of Merrickville-Wolford, in recognizing and abiding by Ontario Regulation 388/97 made under the *Fire Protection and Prevention Act, 1997*, has implemented a by-law to prescribe the precautions and conditions under which fires may be set in open air.

The Open-Air Burning Permit system is permissive, user-friendly and is aligned with current legislation and local by-laws. The permits are still free and available online, at the municipal office or library if residents are unable to access the electronic version. The permit is effective for one year and allows for ease of notifying the MFD when burning as well as informing the individual of the current fire risk and immediately notifying them if there is a burning ban in effect. It is the responsibility of the individual burning to notify the Fire Department by calling **613-706-2330** when they plan on burning. Exemptions to the burning permit are a small contained fire supervised always and used to cook food in a grill or barbeque. There were **496** burn permits issued in 2020. The MFD responded to few burning complaints and no fines were issued in 2020.

ASSOCIATION AND DEPARTMENT INITIATIVES

As recognized in the past, the MFD members are dedicated to the service of their community and their support goes well beyond answering the call for emergencies. This year has proven to be like no other and did not allow for any fundraising events to take place due to COVID-19.

The Fire Department was successful in obtaining a grant from Enbridge Gas for the sum of \$5,000 to go towards the purchase of a new thermal imager. This will give the department two imagers to work with.

BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:

To date, the financial expenditures for 2020 have aligned with the approved 2020 budget.

LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLANS:

On January 23, 2017, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford passed By-Law 10-17, being a by-law to adopt the Merrickville-Wolford Strategic Plan 2017-2025.

BY-LAW 04-2021

BEING A BY-LAW TO CONFIRM THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF MERRICKVILLE-WOLFORD AT ITS MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 11, 2021

This by-law shall come into force and take effect immediately upon the final passing thereof.
