## EBO 188: The system expansion guideline

- Enbridge is regulated by the Ontario Energy Board (the "OEB"). Two of the OEB's main objectives are to:

1. To protect the interests of consumers with respect to prices and the reliability and quality of gas service, and;
2. To facilitate rational expansion gas of transmission and distribution systems.

- In 1998, the OEB established guidelines for the expansion of natural gas service in its EBO 188 Report.
- The intent of EBO 188 was to facilitate the expansion of natural gas service while holding existing customers harmless from the cost of new connections.
- This meant that over the life of the projects, customers must pay the entire cost to service through the rates charged by the utility or through a capital contribution to prevent the cross-subsidization across customers.


## Natural Gas Expansion Program: Phase Two

- In December 2019, the Government of Ontario announced it is continuing to expand access to safe, reliable, and affordable natural gas to rural, northern and Indigenous communities.
- As part of the announcement, the Government sent a letter to every Mayor in Ontario advising them of the Natural Gas Expansion Program.
- The Program will allocate approximately $\$ 130$ million to support new natural gas expansion projects over a three-year period from 2021 to 2023.
- The OEB held a consultative process, which will result in the Guidelines for how project submissions will look, and how projects will be selected. Enbridge Gas contributed to this process.


## Phase Two: Next Steps

- The Ontario Energy Board will release Guidelines, and then open a 90-day project submission period.
- Enbridge Gas will submit projects to the Ontario Energy Board for funding consideration.
- Get in touch with us if your municipality is interested in having a project submitted for funding consideration. Ensure your MPP is aware of your municipality's interest as well.
- The Ontario Energy Board will review the submissions and submit a report on eligible natural gas expansion projects to the Minister of Energy, Northern Development and Mines.
- Using the Guidelines set by the Ontario Energy Board, the Minister of Energy, Northern Development and Mines will issue a decision on future expansion projects. This is expected in Q3 2020.

BY-LAW 10-2020

## BEING A BY-LAW TO ADOPT A REVISED OFFICIAL PLAN FOR THE VILLAGE OF MERRICKVILLE-WOLFORD

WHEREAS section 5(3) of the Municipal Act, 2001 states that municipal power, including a municipality's capacity, rights, powers and privileges, shall be exercised by by-law, unless the municipality is specifically authorized to do otherwise;


#### Abstract

AND WHEREAS section 26(1) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13, as amended, provides that if an official plan is in effect in a municipality, the council of the municipality that adopted the official plan shall, in accordance with subsection (1.1), revise the official plan as required to ensure that it conforms with provincial plans or does not conflict with them, as the case may be; has regard to the matters of provincial interest listed in Section 2; and is consistent with policy statements issued under subsection 3(1);


AND WHEREAS section 26(1.1) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P. 13, as amended, provides that council shall revise the plan no less frequently than, 10 years after it comes into effect as a new official plan; and every five years thereafter, unless the plan has been replaced by another new official plan;

AND WHEREAS section 17(22) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13, as amended, provides that when the requirements of section $17(15)$ to (21) have been met and the council is satisfied that the plan as finally prepared is suitable for adoption, the council may by by-law adopt all or part of the plan and, unless the plan is exempt from approval, submit it for approval;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford, in accordance with section $17(22)$ is satisfied that the plan is suitable for adoption and deems it expedient that the official plan be submitted for approval to the approval authority;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford hereby enacts as follows:

1. The Vilage of Merrickville-Wolford Revised Official Plan, consisting of the maps and explanatory text, included herewith under separate cover, is hereby adopted.
2. The CAO/Clerk/Director, Economic Development is hereby authorized to notify persons or agencies requiring such notification under Section 17 of the Planning Act.
3. The CAO/Clerk/Director, Economic Development is hereby authorized and directed to make application to the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville for the approval of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford Official Plan under Section 17 of the Planning Act.
4. This by-law shall come into force and take effect immediately upon the final passing thereof.

Dear Sirs,
Thank you for the letter dated November 11, 2019 in response to our letter of June 30, 2019. We are pleased that the Village deems the Blockhouse Museum to be a highly valued institution in the community and appreciates the Merrickville and District Historical Society's (MDHS's) dedication and service in operating the Museum for so many years. We remain hopeful that our two organizations can work together beginning in early in 2020 to ensure that the Blockhouse Museum can be operated in during summer 2020.

Though we highlighted many issues in our letter dated August 26, 2019, the content of the letter was to advise the Village of the nature and variety of some long-standing issues that need to be addressed. As we noted in our meeting with staff on September 16,2019 , our primary concern remains the lack of governance under which the Blockhouse Museum is operated. This needs to be clarified so that both the village of Merrickville-Wolford and MDHS have a common understanding of the rights and responsibilities associated with the Blockhouse and that adequate protections are in place for both of our organizations. Operating within a recognized legal framework (lease, memorandum of understanding, etc.) is required so that our activities are covered by insurance and that we can make sound grant applications.

While we appreciate the Village's continued support through the action items listed on pages 2-3 of your letter, the Village's lack of firm commitment to schedule a follow-on meeting to begin to work towards a plan leaves the MDHS uncertain about how to proceed. The grant application process for Young Canada Work (which has traditionally yieided MDHS two students) closed on January 15, 2020. Without a process to resolve the issue of supervision for summer staff, it may be that the MDHS will choose to pass on this opportunity for summer 2020 pending resolution of governance and legal issues.

MDHS would be happy to contribute to the Village's own staffing process (assisting with interviews, providing training) resulting from the Canada Summer Jobs grant.

There are other issues on the horizon which will affect our ability to operate the Blockhouse Museum in summer 2020. Specifically, the MDHS would like to know:

1. What has been the response from Parks Canada to the communications initiated by the CAO prior to November 11, 2019? If there has been no response, what is plan to re-approach Parks Canada by the Village? Your letter of November 11 indicated that was on the critical path to resolution of the governance issue.
2. Can the Village of Merrickville-Wolford share a copy of its Parks Canada license for the Merrickville Blockhouse with MDHS?
3. Will the Village of Merickville-Wolford be allocating resources (chiefly staff time) in 2020 to develop a plan to resolve the governance issue associated with the operation of the Blockhouse Museum? The MDHS is prepared to work with the Village on this issue and has allocated funds in its 2020 budget to support its part in this activity. We are anxious to start as early in posslble in 2020 in order to prepare for summer 2020.
4. When will the Merrickville and District Historical Society be approached in conjunction with planning for budget 2020? Due to the lapse in governance fthe suspension of the Museum Board) there is no formal channel to submit our budget to the Village of Merrickville-Wolford. We will be submitting our budget outlining both our anticipated revenue for the Village and our expenditures for which we would like compensation by January 31, 2020. We trust that there will be ongoing funding as there has been for the last 52 years.

On a related note, the MDHS notes that the Village will be standing up the Herltage Advisory Committee on January 28, 2020. This is an encouraging development given that Merrickville-Wolford identified heritage as key piliar in its Strategic Plan (By-Law 10-17). While this is an inaugurai meeting, we are hopeful that some of the broader issues identifled in the By-Law can find their way on the agenda for 2020. As the Village of Merrickville-Wolford's Bylaw 10-17 notes,

The community also has many important and unique assets which will provide a sound foundation for its future development. These include its heritage structures, natural resources, artists and artisans, health services, and its strategic location. (p. 11)

Rural and Heritage Nature - Nurture and enhance rural and heritage character

- Signage and Q-cube identifiers on historical bulldings containing information about the building
- Coherent Heritage site sign posting system
- Look to incentives to encourage historical building preservation
- Consider Carleton Place model (council more active in preservation)
- Municipal Historical Designation Voluntary (p. 31)

It would indeed be a shame if the Blockhouse Museum situated in the UNESCO World Heritage Site, which, according to the Strategic Plan, provides this community with a major competitive advantage, couid not be operated in the summer of 2020.

MDHS appreciates the goodwill on the part of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford with respect to resolving the issue of governance. However, with no concrete commitment in the letter of November 11 to begin to work together to resolve the governance issue, MDHS is beginning to consider that it may not be possible to assume the risks associated with running a Museum in the Merrickville Blockhouse in summer 2020.

I trust you will accept this letter and our Executive Committee looks forward to a meeting with members of Councll and/or staff to begin to build a plan that provides sufficient support for the Blockhouse Museum in summer 2020.

## A question of "Ensuring Efficient, Effective Services and Civic Engagement" ${ }^{1}$

The identification by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF) of additional wetlands, in Merrickville-Wolford's new Official Plan, has led to debate and discussion amongst residents, landowners and elected officials.

Hilary Thomson's article entitled "Property owners fight back against new wetland designation", in the February 5 edition of the North Grenville Times, is helpful in highlighting some of the current concerns. It also describes Council's reaction to two landowners' issues with the increased wetland designation on their properties.

I am concerned that Council, in its support for these landowners, may have opened the door to ongoing demands, on the part of developers, to make representations to provincial ministries on their behalf.

Our municipality's new Official Plan and the Strategic Plan attempt to reflect the need for balance between development and environmental preservation. No such balance was evident in the resolution of Council to have MNRF "back-up their decision for deeming this area in the Village as a Provincially Significant Wetland, and to re-evaluate their decision without delay."

The 2017-2025 Merrickville-Wolford Strategic Plan identified priorities and strategies to help guide Council's decisions. The priority of ensuring efficient, effective services and civic engagement appeared, when developed and adopted, to be directly tied to ensuring that other priorities within the plan including "protecting heritage, rural, and natural environments" would be considered and supported.

The plan saw the municipality valuing both thoughtful development and envisioning "a community that preserves local natural beauty and ecosystems".

It appears that Council, as is its right, chose not to invite its own Planning Advisory Chair or its own Environment Committee to comment or provide input prior to passing the motion.

The relationship of this Council to its Committees is not clear to me.

When topics like wetlands, that affect both development and the environment, arise, there is a need to refer issues and concerns to all stakeholders and related committees.

Council and Committees, supported by staff, need to constantly recognize the seriousness and sensitivity of topics such as wetlands, private property, development and the natural environment. Supporting one side of a debate without due consideration of the other side does no good.

I would like to encourage the Municipality to adopt an approach where the viewpoints of all relevant committees are taken into account prior to Council taking a position on any given issue. Support for committee chairs and committee members in their efforts, to contribute to the municipality and its residents and to inform Council decision making, is required.

As the appointed sign company for the Conseil de ecoles Catholiques du Centre-Est, we are installing approximately forty (40) of our mobile signs at Catholic schools all over the region to remind parents and guardians that it is time for Kindergarten registration for the 2020/2021 school year.

We had submitted an application to place a mobile sign at the property of Sainte-MargueriteBourgeoys at 306 Read St. After a brief discussion with one of your bylaw officers, Jerry Jopling, we were told that as stated in the town bylaw, the sign could not exceed 5 sq . feet ( $2 \mathrm{ft} \times 2 \mathrm{ft}$ ) as the school is located in a residential zone.

## BACKGROUND:

In 2016, the former Council adopted Resolution \#R-062-16 to move towards full cost recovery of the water and wastewater costs on a user-pay basis, in accordance with the legislation and to establish a minimum 10\% increase each year from 2016 to 2021 until this is achieved. Each year, Council approves the water and wastewater rates for the year.


#### Abstract

ANALYSIS: The Sustainable Water and Sewage Systems Act, 2002, requires municipalities to assess the costs of water and wastewater, and to charge appropriate rates to generate sufficient revenue to finance capital and operating costs of sewer and water systems. The Sustainable Water and Sewage Systems Act, requires municipalities to institute full cost accounting and recovery for water and wastewater services.

Applying a $10 \%$ increase to the water and wastewater rates, the base user rates for residential and multi-residential water and wastewater classes combined will increase from $\$ 126.60$ to $\$ 139.26$, per unit, per month. The Industrial, Commercial and Institutional classes will see a base user rate increase from $\$ 194.04$ to $\$ 213.44$, per unit, monthly. The base rate for properties on water only will increase from $\$ 42.20$ to $\$ 46.42$. The base rate includes up to 7.5 cubic metres per unit, per month. The rates for metered water/wastewater, after 7.5 cubic metres per unit, per month, will increase from $\$ 6.74$ to $\$ 7.41$ per cubic metre, and for water only users from $\$ 2.23$ to $\$ 2.45$.


While the operating costs for water and wastewater services are approaching full-cost recovery, the Village has insufficient funds set aside for water and wastewater capital infrastructure projects. Currently, there is only approximately $\$ 70,000$ in reserve for future infrastructure needs. The costs of capital work on underground infrastructure, would suggest that the amount of the reserve should be between $\$ 750,000$ to \$1,000,000.

The proposed By-law 09-2020, in Schedule " B ", would amend By -law 24-03, to provide that the cost of supplying and installing meters will be charged to the property owner. As such, the cost for meters (new or replacement) and for meter reader repairs will now be based on the actual costs of materials and labour, in accordance with the legislation.

By-law 24-03 allows the Village to shut off the water supply of any ratepayer whose account is overdue. The last time this practice was undertaken was 2015, however, the Village will be reinstating this practice for all accounts as per Section I of the by-law, attached hereto as Schedule " A " to this report. Currently, amounts outstanding over 120 days are transferred to the property tax account, and this has increased the amount of property tax arrears. Both the municipal auditor and Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing have noted that our property tax arrears are too high and must be reduced.

## BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:

The 2020 draft budget will include the estimated revenue due to the increase in user rates. The user fees for water are estimated to be $\$ 409,259$ and for wastewater \$735,560.

## LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLANS:

On January 23, 2017, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of MerrickvilleWolford passed By-Law 10-17, being a by-law to adopt the Merrickville-Wolford Strategic Plan 2017-2025.

The priorities of the strategic plan that can be linked to this report are as follows:

## Ensuring efficient, effective services and civic engagement:

Fiscal sustainability is an important part of providing efficient services to ratepayers.

## Conclusion:

Staff recommend that Council adopt By-law 09-2020, attached as Schedule "B" to this report, being a by-law to implement the new water and wastewater rates for 2020.

## Schedule "A" to FIN-04-2020

## 1. OVERDUE ACCOUNTS

1. Should a deposit or an account remain unpaid fifteen (15) days after the due date, a Final Notice may be sent by mail to the consumer, reminding the consumer of the outstanding amount.
2. Should a deposit or an account not be paid in full on or before the due date, a late payment charge of eight percent ( $8 \%$ ) of the current charges owing on the due date shall be added to the amount owing.
3. Should a deposit or an account not be paid in full within thirty (30) days of the due date, a monthly interest charge of $1.25 \%$ ( $15 \%$ per annum) shall be added to the outstanding account until such time as the account is paid in full.
4. Should a deposit or account remain unpaid thirty (30) days after the billing due date, a Notice of Disconnection may be delivered by the Corporation to the consumer or any other interested party, advising the consumer or other interested party that unless payment is received within seven (7) days, the water service may be restricted or disconnected.
5. Should the Corporation be required to deliver Notice of Disconnection, a charge shall be applied to the outstanding account. The rates for the Notice of Disconnection charge are set out in Schedule "B" of this by-law.
6. Accounts relating to the installation and repair of meters or service pipes shall be payable by the owner of the property. If the owner of any premises omits, neglects or refuses to pay any invoice rendered, whether for water, service pipes, meter, service charge or any other monies to which the Corporation may be entitled in respect to such premises, the Corporation may at its discretion shut off the water to the premises and such charges shall remain a lien on the property and may be collected in the like manner as taxes. The invoice shall be deemed to be served upon the owner if it is delivered or sent by mail to the premises supplied.
7. In accordance with Section I.4., the Corporation may, in default of payment of any deposit or account, shut-off the supply of water to the premises. The Corporation shall not be liable for any damages to property or injury to persons by reason of shut-off of water supply.
8. In case there are any arrears of water/sewer service rates, or any other rates or charges owing to the Corporation under this by-law, charged against any property, the water shall not be turned on for service of such premises until all such arrears are paid, but the Corporation reserves all right to collect the charges for water supplied, and all other charges owing to the Corporation. If unpaid after 120 days, the amount will be added to the tax roll in accordance with section 427(3) of the Municipal Act 2001.
9. Any payment received shall be applied firstly to outstanding interest and secondly, to outstanding charges under this by-law.
10. Where it has been necessary to discontinue service as a result of non-payment, a reconnection charge will be levied against the delinquent account, in addition to the applicable Notice of Disconnection charge. The reconnection charge rate shall be paid by the owner or occupant, in advance, and shall be in the amount set out in Schedule " $B$ " of this by-law.
11. A record shall be maintained in the offices of the Corporation, which shall contain the assessment number, street number and location of premises from which the water supply has been turned off for non-payment of accounts and the sum remaining unpaid. Such records shall be maintained for inspection by any person or persons considering the purchase of any property, for the purposes of informing said person or persons of the status of the account.
