

## BACKGROUND:

In order to keep Council fully apprised of the operations of the By-Law Enforcement department, a quarterly report outlining departmental progress is provided to Council.

## ANALYSIS:

Please see Schedule "A" to this report for an illustrative graph comparing the second quarter results from 2017 and 2018.

Please See Schedule "B" to this report for the Traffic Speed Sign report.

During the period from April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018 to June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018, of significant note are the following:

1. There were three property clean ups in 2018 compared to the nine in the 2nd quarter of last year;

- 2. Illegal signs removed are down by 23 from the 2nd quarter of last year;
- 3. Parking tickets issued are lower in the 2nd quarter this year than 2017; and

4. There was a decrease of parking warnings issued from the amount issued in the 2nd quarter of last year.

Please note that the decrease in parking tickets was due to the process of speaking with the owners of the illegally parked vehicles and having them move their vehicle to prevent parking tickets from being handed out. Creating awareness and communicating with the public was a main objective.

Over the last quarter the electronic speed control/driver feedback sign was placed at 3 locations across the municipality as follows:

- 1. St. Lawrence Street April 5<sup>th</sup> to April 27<sup>th</sup>
- 2. Main Street West April 28th to May 25th
- 3. Read Street May 26th to June 5th

Between April 5, 2018 to June 5, 2018, it has recorded the speed of 39,597 vehicles, of which 9,274 were going at speeds greater than 50 km/h, however 2,730 of those vehicles were not going at speeds greater than 55 km/h, leaving 6,544 vehicles going excess of the speed limit. The highest speed recorded in a 50-km zone was 115 kilometres per hour, recorded on Monday, May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018 on Main Street West.

## BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:

The budget implications are identified in the 2018 municipal budget.

## LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLANS:

On January 23, 2017, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford passed By-Law 10-17, being a by-law to adopt the Merrickville-Wolford Strategic Plan 2017-2025.

The priorities of the strategic plan that can be linked to this report are as follows:

**Ensuring efficient, effective services and civic engagement:** By being able to compare data from previous years, trends may be identified which may be further analyzed to conclude if there are issues that may need to be addressed. Making this information available to Council and the public ensures transparency and is in keeping with the priority to ensure efficient and effective services are being delivered to the residents of Merrickville-Wolford.



By way of background, Merrickville's Jazz Fest is planned to be a four-day musical event which will be held at various venues in the village, October 11-14. We expect to attract over 1000 visitors. - 18 coroplast signs (seven 2ft X 2ft and eleven 1.5ft X 2ft signs) at various high traffic locations throughout Merrickville. These would be installed on lawns with the approval of private owners and would display our logo and the words "Merrickville's Jazz Fest" with the dates. We would install them ourselves on September 21 just before the start Merrickville Artists Tour and would remove them within a week of the Jazz festival end.

- A-Frame signs at the entrances to the various venues during the festival (ie during the period October 11-14), directing visitors inside. We would ensure that they would not impede street traffic and would be responsible for ensuring that they are erected and removed in a timely way. They would be placed about 6 hours before the various events. The venues are: Merrickville United Church, Holy Trinity Anglican Church, St Ann Catholic Church, Goose and Gridiron, Merrickville Community Centre, and the Baldachin Inn Dining Room and Ball Room.

- Two vinyl banners 4ftx20ft to be hung on commercial private property ie the Baldachin Inn and the Christmas Shop, to go up as soon as approval is given or failing that 30 days prior to the festival and taken down within five days of the completion of the festival. We would greatly prefer to have at least 6 weeks for the display of these banners to ensure effective advertising of the event to visitors to the Village.

- Exemption from all village fees for signage.

We have also completed as best we could the form attached to Bylaw 24-2010, which is submitted with the paper copy of this message.

OBJECTIVE:	To update Council with respect to the functions of the Building
	and Planning Department for the second quarter of 2018
	compared to the second quarter results of 2017.

### RECOMMENDATION:

That Council receive report CBO-06-2018, being the second quarter results of the Building and Planning Department, for information purposes.

### BACKGROUND:

The Building and Planning Department regularly receives and reviews various applications for construction and demolition permits as well as those for planning development.

The review of permit applications plus the issuance (or refusal of the issuance) of construction and demolition permits typically may require site inspections and approvals as mandated under the Building Code. These results are linked to the data as provided in Schedules "A" and "B" attached.

Similarly, Schedule "A" includes the review of planning development applications including Minor Variances, Zoning/Official Plans, Site Plan Control Agreements and consents which often require site inspections to facilitate compliance with Village and County planning documents as well as processing as applicable under the <u>Planning Act.</u>

### ANALYSIS:

In considering the graphs appended to this report, it appears that the second quarter of 2018 had has seen an equal number of applications for zoning. The number of consents received/facilitated compared to the second quarter of 2017 rose dramatically. There were two applications for Minor Variance in 2018 compared to just one application last year at this time.

A single site plan control application was received/facilitated in this quarter and during the same period in 2017.

One Official Plan Amendment has been approved thus far in 2018 compared to none in 2017.

Growth of the municipality is increasing, yet it is managed and orderly.

With respect to the number of construction permits issued. The second quarter of 2018 witnessed a total of 27 construction and demolition permits issued compared to 33 permits issued in the same period in 2017. One demolition permit has been issued in 2018's second quarter compared to two issued during the same period in 2017.

The 2018 second quarter number of inspections carried out by this department totaled 192 which was a large increase compared to just 115 inspections carried out in the 2017 second quarter. Despite the slow arrival of Spring temperatures in March and April, it has none the less clearly been an extremely active quarter for construction thus far.

The month of May saw the issuance of 9 new housing starts.

The value of construction and demolition activity increased substantially in the second quarter of 2018. The total value of construction increased about 3 fold from \$1,587,520 in the second quarter of 2017 to \$4,572,200 in 2018.

### BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:

The budget implications are identified in the 2018 municipal budget.

The legal implications are non-applicable.

# LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLANS:

The Village of Merrickville-Wolford Strategic Plan By-law 10-17, as adopted by Council on January 23, 2017 provides on Page 26 of the document a specific basis for Performance Monitoring with Macro Indicators such as population growth being directly tied to Housing Starts.

One theme consistently mentioned throughout the Plan is that of "Growing the Economy" and, by association, that there is a need for orderly growth of the residential and commercial aspects of the Village "to ensure its financial viability". This orderly growth is accomplished in many ways through well thought out approvals of consents, site plan agreements as well as zoning, minor variances and official plan amendments.

# CONCLUSION

The second quarter of this year showed a great increase in construction permit and planning development activity. The 2018 second quarter overall saw consistently more requests for inspections, permit issuances and planning development applications.

All indications for the remaining year point to ongoing construction and development, though this is always dependent upon local and national economic factors.

The Village of Merrickville-Wolford is presently undertaking a review and updating of its current Official Plan. It is anticipated that the new Official Plan will be approved this year. This document shall implement the most recent Provincial Policy Statements as required under the <u>Planning Act</u> and in so doing, shall ensure that the increasing construction and planning development is managed in a financially viable and environmentally sustainable manner.

# RE: 2nd Quarter Report (April 1<sup>st</sup> to June 30th)

**OBJECTIVE:** To provide Council with an update regarding the second quarter activity of the Merrickville Fire Department, for information purposes.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT: Council receives report FD-06-2018, for information purposes.

### BACKGROUND:

In keeping with the Village's commitment of openness and transparency to Council and the public, it is deemed prudent to report quarterly statistics to keep Council and the public informed of the progress of the Merrickville Fire Department (MFD).

### ANALYSIS:

The second quarter has been consistent with emergency calls from 2017 due to medical assist calls and public assistance calls. We have seen reductions in false alarm and CO alarm calls.

The MFD responds to approximately 80 calls for service each year. Seasonal and tourist activity traditionally provides an increase in call volume over the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> quarters. The calls are primarily responses to medical assists (due to paramedics having to respond from Smiths Falls or Kemptville), motor vehicle collisions and fire/carbon monoxide alarms. (**Reference: Appendix A for 2nd quarter call statistics**).

The focus of the Merrickville Fire Department is the protection of all firefighters and citizens in Merrickville-Wolford. This is accomplished by the dedication and time committed to training and equipment maintenance/inspection by all members. Ensuring that the training program(s) for the firefighters is attainable, accessible and to a recognized provincial standard is critical to the level of service expected from the citizens we serve. The MFD has adopted the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Firefighter 1 & 2, 1001 Training Program and has been following this for the past 5 years. Training occurs every second Tuesday evening and vehicle/equipment checks and drill nights occur on the opposite Tuesday nights for each of the four platoons over a two-month period.

The recently adopted amendments to the Fire Protection and Prevention Act (FPPA), were recently released by the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services (MCSCS) and include:

- 1. Firefighter Mandatory Certification, starting January 1, 2019;
- 2. Community Risk Assessment; and
- 3. Public response time reporting.

We are continuing to work through the new legislation and submissions for firefighters that can qualify for grandfathering by the end of September 2018.

# FIREFIGHTER HOURS:

Total Training hours:	2 <sup>nd</sup> Quarter = <b>321 hours</b>
Total Part-Time (paid) Chief hours:	2 <sup>nd</sup> Quarter = <b>286 hours</b>
Total Emergency Call hours:	2 <sup>nd</sup> Quarter = <b>277 hours</b>

# VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT:

The second quarter was very busy with the completion of ground ladder testing (NFPA-1932 standard), Ladder -1 ladder testing, completion of hydrostatic testing on our Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) air cylinders and cascade breathing air system. All fire apparatus received and passed their annual pump testing (Pump 4, Ladder 1 and Pumper/tanker – 1). Regular inspection and annual testing of individual Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is on-going and the 10-year life span of this equipment is monitored and replaced as required under the NFPA Standards. All equipment has been tested as per the standards with only minor repairs to some of the older ground ladders and individual PPE.

We added our Utility Transport Vehicle (UTV) to our fleet through 100% funding from third party donations and Firefighter Association fundraising initiatives. The UTV will enhance our Rural Response Program that was started a few years back with the fundraising efforts of our members to purchase our brush truck and forestry skid unit.

The UTV will be fitted with a skid unit that will allow for the safe transport of firefighters, allied agencies and an injured patient or equipment into/out of rural areas. The UTV was used within 5 days of taking possession of the unit to assist the OPP at a local incident that the MFD was also required to attend. We are confident that the addition of this resource will only assist our members with allowing for improved responses to meet the needs of our rural citizens and visitors to Merrickville-Wolford.

It is equipped with LED Emergency lighting to warn the public and protect the firefighters while operating in low light and traffic conditions. You will notice that as of

July 1, 2018, other emergency services in Ontario are permitted to cast a "blue" light to warn individuals of first responders working in an area. Prior to this change in the Highway Traffic Act (HTA), only police vehicles and snow plows were permitted to display blue emergency lights. Our UTV is the first vehicle in our fleet to display "blue" emergency lighting. When the UTV is fully completed, we will be announcing and presenting the unit to our donating sponsors, elected officials and public.

# **BURNING PERMITS**

The Village of Merrickville-Wolford, in recognizing and abiding by Ontario Regulation 388/97 made under the *Fire Protection and Prevention Act, 1997*, has implemented a by-law to prescribe the precautions and conditions under which fires may be set in open air.

Our Open-Air Burning Permit system is permissive, user-friendly and is aligned with current legislation and local by-laws. The permits are still free and available online, at the municipal office or library if residents are unable to access the electronic version. The permit is effective for one year and allows for ease of notifying the MFD when burning as well as informing the individual of the current fire risk and immediately notifying them if there is a burning ban in effect. It is the responsibility of the individual burning to notify the Fire Department by calling 613-706-2330 when they plan on burning. Exemptions to the burning permit are a small contained fire supervised always and used to cook food in a grill or barbeque.

This year was the first activation (individual notification) of the permit system to advise all persons that registered for a Burning Permit of the burning ban (July 10th to July 25th) due to dry conditions and very low rainfall. All departments in Leeds & Grenville also applied the burning ban throughout this time as well.

This system has been reflected in an added cost to the Fire Prevention budget line by \$1,500.00, annually. Depending on the season and possible need of other fire bans, we may need to consider a fee system in 2019 to offset the expense to our fire prevention budget. The fire prevention budget was not adjusted (increased) to accommodate this new program.

# ASSOCIATION AND DEPARTMENT INIATIVES

I am very pleased to report, with community and corporate sponsors as well as individual donations to the Firefighters Association, our Fire Prevention program for 2018 is off to an amazing start.

The MFD was accepted to participate in Enbridge Gas Distribution and Fire Marshal's Public Safety Council 2018 Project Zero campaign that provided **102 Kidde Canada 10-year worry-free combination (smoke and CO) alarms with a retail value of approximately \$6,118.00.** These combination alarms will be distributed to our vulnerable residents throughout Merrickville-Wolford at no charge during our 2018 fire prevention activities. Enbridge Gas Distribution has been a major corporate partner for the MFD over the years and in 2017, donated \$5000.00 for training manuals for our members and an \$8000.00 donation to our UTV initiative. I wish to recognize their

continued support and dedication to community safety, improving the quality and capacity of our first responder resources throughout the areas Enbridge serve.

As recognized in the past our MFD members are dedicated to the service of their community and their support goes well beyond answering the call for emergencies. Over the past quarter our members have contributed **122 hours** of voluntary service for events such as the Heritage Classic Run, Municipal Open House, Canada Day Parade and Fireworks. As Chief, I am continually humbled by the sense of community and commitment of my Firefighters in the support of these community initiatives, not to mention the continued fundraising activities by our Firefighters Association for the addition of equipment to better serve our citizens and visitors to Merrickville-Wolford. Their dedication, passion and commitment is clearly recognized and appreciated.

# **BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:**

To date, the financial expenditures for the second quarter have aligned with the approved 2018 budget.



### BACKGROUND:

In order to keep Council fully apprised of the operations of the Finance Department, a quarterly report outlining departmental progress is provided to Council.

### ANALYSIS:

During the second quarter of 2018, the Finance Department have prepared reports for Council and enacted the 2018 Tax Rate By-law. The following projects occurred during the second quarter of 2018:

- 2017 Year End audit completed
- First and Second Quarter HST rebate reports filed for Village and Library
- Our accounting clerk, Traci Vandusen, has collected \$90,839 in tax arrears
- Final tax billing completed including supplementary new billings
- Completed Energy Audit report for municipal facilities as per Ont Reg 397/11
- Received first installment of OCIF top up funding in the amount of \$1,045,000
- Main Street Funding agreement was signed, which provides \$40,359 to be used for main street areas revitalization initiatives; eligible projects will be considered in the 2019 budget process
- Brought a report to Council to pass a resolution requesting the Minister of Finance consider increasing the high-tonnage railway rate to \$300 per acre, which would result in an extra \$12,115 if approved
- All staff participated in the municipal open house
- Completed 2017 Gas Tax Year End reporting

Schedule A provides a breakdown of non-taxation operating revenues and operating expenses for the first half of the year. Total revenues is at 43% of the budget for the year, and operating expenses are at 49%. There are no concerns at this time. A capital variance report will be provided with the next quarterly report. As of June 30<sup>th</sup>, many of the capital projects were only in the beginning phases.

Schedule B provides a breakdown of the water and wastewater costs incurred through June 30<sup>th</sup> from the Ontario Clean Water Agency (OCWA). Total costs for both are at 45% of the total budgeted amounts. As of June 30<sup>th</sup>, OCWA water and wastewater expenditures are within budget.

RE: 2nd Quarter Report (April 1<sup>st</sup> to June 30<sup>th</sup>)

# **OBJECTIVE:** To provide Council with an update regarding the second quarter results of the By-Law Enforcement Department, for information purposes.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

### THAT: Council receive report BLEO-03-2018 for information purposes.

### BACKGROUND:

In order to keep Council fully apprised of the operations of the By-Law Enforcement department, a quarterly report outlining departmental progress is provided to Council.

### ANALYSIS:

Please see Schedule "A" to this report for an illustrative graph comparing the second quarter results from 2017 and 2018.

Please See Schedule "B" to this report for the Traffic Speed Sign report.

During the period from April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018 to June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018, of significant note are the following:

1. There were three property clean ups in 2018 compared to the nine in the 2nd quarter of last year;

- 2. Illegal signs removed are down by 23 from the 2nd quarter of last year;
- 3. Parking tickets issued are lower in the 2nd quarter this year than 2017; and

4. There was a decrease of parking warnings issued from the amount issued in the 2nd quarter of last year.

Please note that the decrease in parking tickets was due to the process of speaking with the owners of the illegally parked vehicles and having them move their vehicle to prevent parking tickets from being handed out. Creating awareness and communicating with the public was a main objective.

Over the last quarter the electronic speed control/driver feedback sign was placed at 3 locations across the municipality as follows:

- 1. St. Lawrence Street April 5<sup>th</sup> to April 27<sup>th</sup>
- 2. Main Street West April 28th to May 25th
- 3. Read Street May 26<sup>th</sup> to June 5<sup>th</sup>

Between April 5, 2018 to June 5, 2018, it has recorded the speed of 39,597 vehicles, of which 9,274 were going at speeds greater than 50 km/h, however 2,730 of those vehicles were not going at speeds greater than 55 km/h, leaving 6,544 vehicles going excess of the speed limit. The highest speed recorded in a 50-km zone was 115 kilometres per hour, recorded on Monday, May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2018 on Main Street West.



Re Signage for Merrickville's Jazz Fest, October 11-14, 2018

Merrickville's Jazz Fest requests approval and/or exemptions from Bylaw 24-2010, 'The Sign Bylaw' under 'Permit Exemption 4.1E ' for temporary signage to publicize our event in a timely and cost effective way.

By way of background, Merrickville's Jazz Fest is planned to be a four-day musical event which will be held at various venues in the village, October 11-14. We expect to attract over 1000 visitors. Our Jazz Fest is an independent cultural activity organized by volunteers and designed to attract villagers and neighbours as well as music fans from the surrounding area. The festival was designed to make a contribution to our community, not only culturally but also financially, attracting visitors at a time of the year when tourism has traditionally dwindled until the holiday season. Merrickville's Jazz Fest attracts increased business for retail outlets, restaurants and accommodation facilities.

We operate as a not for profit and over our seven seasons, a portion of the net proceeds from the event has been used to support local interests: the local churches, the Merrickville Legion, a local children's reading project called "Fun with Books", music programming in Merrickville Public School, Wolford Public School, Merrickville French Catholic School and the Merrickville Day Nursery School.

We acknowledge the financial support received from the Village of Merrickville Wolford and the support received from the Merrickville Legion as well as the Anglican, Roman Catholic and United Churches opening their doors to us, providing venue space free of charge.

Here is what we are requesting by way of signage for the 2018 Festival:

- 18 coroplast signs (seven 2ft X 2ft and eleven 1.5ft X 2ft signs) at various high traffic locations throughout Merrickville. These would be installed on lawns with the approval of private owners and would display our logo and the words "Merrickville's Jazz Fest" with the dates. We would install them ourselves on September 21 just before the start Merrickville Artists Tour and would remove them within a week of the Jazz festival end.

- A-Frame signs at the entrances to the various venues during the festival (ie during the period October 11-14), directing visitors inside. We would ensure that they would not impede street traffic and would be responsible for ensuring that they are erected and removed in a timely way. They would be placed about 6 hours before the various events. The venues are: Merrickville United Church, Holy Trinity Anglican Church, St Ann Catholic Church, Goose and Gridiron, Merrickville Community Centre, and the Baldachin Inn Dining Room and Ball Room.

- Two vinyl banners 4ftx20ft to be hung on commercial private property ie the Baldachin Inn and the Christmas Shop, to go up as soon as approval is given or failing that 30 days prior to the festival and taken down within five days of the completion of the festival. We would greatly prefer to have at least 6 weeks for the display of these banners to ensure effective advertising of the event to visitors to the Village.

- Exemption from all village fees for signage.

We have also completed as best we could the form attached to Bylaw 24-2010, which is submitted with the paper copy of this message.

OBJECTIVE:	To update Council with respect to the functions of the Building	
	and Planning Department for the second quarter of 2018	
compared to the second quarter results of 2017.		

### RECOMMENDATION:

That Council receive report CBO-06-2018, being the second quarter results of the Building and Planning Department, for information purposes.

### BACKGROUND:

The Building and Planning Department regularly receives and reviews various applications for construction and demolition permits as well as those for planning development.

The review of permit applications plus the issuance (or refusal of the issuance) of construction and demolition permits typically may require site inspections and approvals as mandated under the Building Code. These results are linked to the data as provided in Schedules "A" and "B" attached.

Similarly, Schedule "A" includes the review of planning development applications including Minor Variances, Zoning/Official Plans, Site Plan Control Agreements and consents which often require site inspections to facilitate compliance with Village and County planning documents as well as processing as applicable under the <u>Planning Act.</u>

### ANALYSIS:

In considering the graphs appended to this report, it appears that the second quarter of 2018 had has seen an equal number of applications for zoning. The number of consents received/facilitated compared to the second quarter of 2017 rose dramatically. There were two applications for Minor Variance in 2018 compared to just one application last year at this time.

A single site plan control application was received/facilitated in this quarter and during the same period in 2017.

One Official Plan Amendment has been approved thus far in 2018 compared to none in 2017.

Growth of the municipality is increasing, yet it is managed and orderly.

With respect to the number of construction permits issued. The second quarter of 2018 witnessed a total of 27 construction and demolition permits issued compared to 33 permits issued in the same period in 2017. One demolition permit has been issued in 2018's second quarter compared to two issued during the same period in 2017.

The 2018 second quarter number of inspections carried out by this department totaled 192 which was a large increase compared to just 115 inspections carried out in the 2017 second quarter. Despite the slow arrival of Spring temperatures in March and April, it has none the less clearly been an extremely active quarter for construction thus far.

The month of May saw the issuance of 9 new housing starts.

The value of construction and demolition activity increased substantially in the second quarter of 2018. The total value of construction increased about 3 fold from \$1,587,520 in the second quarter of 2017 to \$4,572,200 in 2018.

### **BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:**

The budget implications are identified in the 2018 municipal budget.

The legal implications are non-applicable.

### LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLANS:

The Village of Merrickville-Wolford Strategic Plan By-law 10-17, as adopted by Council on January 23, 2017 provides on Page 26 of the document a specific basis for Performance Monitoring with Macro Indicators such as population growth being directly tied to Housing Starts.

One theme consistently mentioned throughout the Plan is that of "Growing the Economy" and, by association, that there is a need for orderly growth of the residential and commercial aspects of the Village "to ensure its financial viability". This orderly growth is accomplished in many ways through well thought out approvals of consents, site plan agreements as well as zoning, minor variances and official plan amendments.

### **CONCLUSION**

The second quarter of this year showed a great increase in construction permit and planning development activity. The 2018 second quarter overall saw consistently more requests for inspections, permit issuances and planning development applications.

All indications for the remaining year point to ongoing construction and development, though this is always dependent upon local and national economic factors.

The Village of Merrickville-Wolford is presently undertaking a review and updating of its current Official Plan. It is anticipated that the new Official Plan will be approved this year. This document shall implement the most recent Provincial Policy Statements as required under the <u>Planning Act</u> and in so doing, shall ensure that the increasing construction and planning development is managed in a financially viable and environmentally sustainable manner.

#### RE: 2nd Quarter Report (April 1<sup>st</sup> to June 30th)

**OBJECTIVE:** To provide Council with an update regarding the second quarter activity of the Merrickville Fire Department, for information purposes.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT: Council receives report FD-06-2018, for information purposes.

#### BACKGROUND:

In keeping with the Village's commitment of openness and transparency to Council and the public, it is deemed prudent to report quarterly statistics to keep Council and the public informed of the progress of the Merrickville Fire Department (MFD).

#### ANALYSIS:

The second quarter has been consistent with emergency calls from 2017 due to medical assist calls and public assistance calls. We have seen reductions in false alarm and CO alarm calls.

The MFD responds to approximately 80 calls for service each year. Seasonal and tourist activity traditionally provides an increase in call volume over the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> quarters. The calls are primarily responses to medical assists (due to paramedics having to respond from Smiths Falls or Kemptville), motor vehicle collisions and fire/carbon monoxide alarms. (**Reference: Appendix A for 2nd quarter call statistics**).

The focus of the Merrickville Fire Department is the protection of all firefighters and citizens in Merrickville-Wolford. This is accomplished by the dedication and time committed to training and equipment maintenance/inspection by all members. Ensuring that the training program(s) for the firefighters is attainable, accessible and to a recognized provincial standard is critical to the level of service expected from the citizens we serve. The MFD has adopted the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Firefighter 1 & 2, 1001 Training Program and has been following this for the past 5 years. Training occurs every second Tuesday evening and vehicle/equipment checks and drill nights occur on the opposite Tuesday nights for each of the four platoons over a two-month period.

The recently adopted amendments to the Fire Protection and Prevention Act (FPPA), were recently released by the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services (MCSCS) and include:

- 1. Firefighter Mandatory Certification, starting January 1, 2019;
- 2. Community Risk Assessment; and
- 3. Public response time reporting.

We are continuing to work through the new legislation and submissions for firefighters that can qualify for grandfathering by the end of September 2018.

#### FIREFIGHTER HOURS:

Total Training hours:	2 <sup>nd</sup> Quarter = <b>321 hours</b>
Total Part-Time (paid) Chief hours:	2 <sup>nd</sup> Quarter = <b>286 hours</b>
Total Emergency Call hours:	2 <sup>nd</sup> Quarter = 277 hours

### VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT:

The second quarter was very busy with the completion of ground ladder testing (NFPA-1932 standard), Ladder -1 ladder testing, completion of hydrostatic testing on our Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) air cylinders and cascade breathing air system. All fire apparatus received and passed their annual pump testing (Pump 4, Ladder 1 and Pumper/tanker – 1). Regular inspection and annual testing of individual Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is on-going and the 10-year life span of this equipment is monitored and replaced as required under the NFPA Standards. All equipment has been tested as per the standards with only minor repairs to some of the older ground ladders and individual PPE.

We added our Utility Transport Vehicle (UTV) to our fleet through 100% funding from third party donations and Firefighter Association fundraising initiatives. The UTV will enhance our Rural Response Program that was started a few years back with the fundraising efforts of our members to purchase our brush truck and forestry skid unit.

The UTV will be fitted with a skid unit that will allow for the safe transport of firefighters, allied agencies and an injured patient or equipment into/out of rural areas. The UTV was used within 5 days of taking possession of the unit to assist the OPP at a local incident that the MFD was also required to attend. We are confident that the addition of this resource will only assist our members with allowing for improved responses to meet the needs of our rural citizens and visitors to Merrickville-Wolford.

It is equipped with LED Emergency lighting to warn the public and protect the firefighters while operating in low light and traffic conditions. You will notice that as of

July 1, 2018, other emergency services in Ontario are permitted to cast a "blue" light to warn individuals of first responders working in an area. Prior to this change in the Highway Traffic Act (HTA), only police vehicles and snow plows were permitted to display blue emergency lights. Our UTV is the first vehicle in our fleet to display "blue" emergency lighting. When the UTV is fully completed, we will be announcing and presenting the unit to our donating sponsors, elected officials and public.

### **BURNING PERMITS**

The Village of Merrickville-Wolford, in recognizing and abiding by Ontario Regulation 388/97 made under the *Fire Protection and Prevention Act, 1997*, has implemented a by-law to prescribe the precautions and conditions under which fires may be set in open air.

Our Open-Air Burning Permit system is permissive, user-friendly and is aligned with current legislation and local by-laws. The permits are still free and available online, at the municipal office or library if residents are unable to access the electronic version. The permit is effective for one year and allows for ease of notifying the MFD when burning as well as informing the individual of the current fire risk and immediately notifying them if there is a burning ban in effect. It is the responsibility of the individual burning to notify the Fire Department by calling 613-706-2330 when they plan on burning. Exemptions to the burning permit are a small contained fire supervised always and used to cook food in a grill or barbeque.

This year was the first activation (individual notification) of the permit system to advise all persons that registered for a Burning Permit of the burning ban (July 10th to July 25th) due to dry conditions and very low rainfall. All departments in Leeds & Grenville also applied the burning ban throughout this time as well.

This system has been reflected in an added cost to the Fire Prevention budget line by \$1,500.00, annually. Depending on the season and possible need of other fire bans, we may need to consider a fee system in 2019 to offset the expense to our fire prevention budget. The fire prevention budget was not adjusted (increased) to accommodate this new program.

### ASSOCIATION AND DEPARTMENT INIATIVES

I am very pleased to report, with community and corporate sponsors as well as individual donations to the Firefighters Association, our Fire Prevention program for 2018 is off to an amazing start.

The MFD was accepted to participate in Enbridge Gas Distribution and Fire Marshal's Public Safety Council 2018 Project Zero campaign that provided **102 Kidde Canada 10-year worry-free combination (smoke and CO) alarms with a retail value of approximately \$6,118.00.** These combination alarms will be distributed to our vulnerable residents throughout Merrickville-Wolford at no charge during our 2018 fire prevention activities. Enbridge Gas Distribution has been a major corporate partner for the MFD over the years and in 2017, donated \$5000.00 for training manuals for our members and an \$8000.00 donation to our UTV initiative. I wish to recognize their

continued support and dedication to community safety, improving the quality and capacity of our first responder resources throughout the areas Enbridge serve.

As recognized in the past our MFD members are dedicated to the service of their community and their support goes well beyond answering the call for emergencies. Over the past quarter our members have contributed **122 hours** of voluntary service for events such as the Heritage Classic Run, Municipal Open House, Canada Day Parade and Fireworks. As Chief, I am continually humbled by the sense of community and commitment of my Firefighters in the support of these community initiatives, not to mention the continued fundraising activities by our Firefighters Association for the addition of equipment to better serve our citizens and visitors to Merrickville-Wolford. Their dedication, passion and commitment is clearly recognized and appreciated.

#### BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:

To date, the financial expenditures for the second quarter have aligned with the approved 2018 budget.

### LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLANS:



**OBJECTIVE:** For information purposes.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT: Council receive report FIN-06-2018 for information purposes.

#### BACKGROUND:

In order to keep Council fully apprised of the operations of the Finance Department, a quarterly report outlining departmental progress is provided to Council.

#### ANALYSIS:

During the second quarter of 2018, the Finance Department have prepared reports for Council and enacted the 2018 Tax Rate By-law. The following projects occurred during the second quarter of 2018:

- 2017 Year End audit completed
- First and Second Quarter HST rebate reports filed for Village and Library
- Our accounting clerk, Traci Vandusen, has collected \$90,839 in tax arrears
- Final tax billing completed including supplementary new billings
- Completed Energy Audit report for municipal facilities as per Ont Reg 397/11
- Received first installment of OCIF top up funding in the amount of \$1,045,000
- Main Street Funding agreement was signed, which provides \$40,359 to be used for main street areas revitalization initiatives; eligible projects will be considered in the 2019 budget process
- Brought a report to Council to pass a resolution requesting the Minister of Finance consider increasing the high-tonnage railway rate to \$300 per acre, which would result in an extra \$12,115 if approved
- All staff participated in the municipal open house
- Completed 2017 Gas Tax Year End reporting

Schedule A provides a breakdown of non-taxation operating revenues and operating expenses for the first half of the year. Total revenues is at 43% of the budget for the year, and operating expenses are at 49%. There are no concerns at this time. A capital variance report will be provided with the next quarterly report. As of June 30<sup>th</sup>, many of the capital projects were only in the beginning phases.

Schedule B provides a breakdown of the water and wastewater costs incurred through June 30<sup>th</sup> from the Ontario Clean Water Agency (OCWA). Total costs for both are at 45% of the total budgeted amounts. As of June 30<sup>th</sup>, OCWA water and wastewater expenditures are within budget.

#### **BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:**

There are no budget implications 2018 municipal budget.
