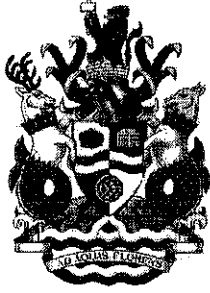

**Present:** Dell Bower, Mayor J. Douglas Struthers, Victor Suthren

**Declaration of Pecuniary Interest and general nature thereof:** None.

**Appointment of Chair:** The Secretary called for nominations for a Chair for 2021. Mayor Struthers nominated Dell Bower to be elected as Chair, and Mr. Bower accepted the nomination. The Secretary called a second and third time for nominations for Chair, but there were none noted.

Moved by Victor Suthren, Seconded by Mayor Struthers. The Village of Merrickville-Wolford Police Services Board appoints Mr. Dell Bower as Chair of the Board for 2021. Carried.

**Appointment of Vice Chair:** The Secretary called for nominations for a Vice Chair for 2021. Dell Bower nominated Victor Suthren, and Mr. Suthren accepted the nomination. The Secretary called a second and third time for nominations for Vice Chair, but there were none noted.

Moved by Dell Bower, Seconded by Mayor Struthers. The Village of Merrickville-Wolford Police Services Board appoints Mr. Victor Suthren as Vice Chair of the Board for 2021. Carried.

**Approval of Agenda:** Moved by Mayor Struthers, Seconded by Dell Bower. The Agenda of the Police Service Board Meeting of March 23, 2021 is hereby approved as amended. Carried.

NOTE: The agenda was amended to include correspondence from the Solicitor General regarding proposed Detachment Boards, to be placed under new business. The agenda was further amended to have the O.P.P. Reports moved to earlier in the agenda, following the approval of the Minutes.

**Minutes:** Moved by Mayor Struthers, seconded by Victor Suthren. The Minutes of the Police Service Board of November 18, 2020 are approved as circulated. Carried.

## **New Business:**

### **1. O.P.P. Reports**

Nancy Graves presented the December 2020 Report which included the year-end statistics. Property crime decreased 62.5% and fraud decreased by 45% from 2019. There were no drug crimes in 2020.

Nancy Graves presented the February 2021 Report. Dell Bower inquired as to whether the O.P.P. conducted snowmobile patrol within the Village. Nancy Graves indicated that the Grenville Detachment does not have snowmobiles but share snowmobiles with the Leeds Detachment, and there is routine snowmobile patrol throughout the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville. Nancy reported that there was a new Community Services Officer who started in February. Nancy also indicated that a speed spy was located near the Merrickville Day Nursery and did not report any vehicles speeding, meaning all of the vehicles were travelling at 49 km/h or less.

Mayor Struthers indicated his observation that in Merrickville-Wolford there is a good resolution of any criminal activities that come to the attention of the O.P.P. and asked whether the O.P.P. would classify the Village as a safe community. Nancy Graves indicated that the data supports that the Village of Merrickville-Wolford is a safe community.

Mayor Struthers inquired regarding correspondence received from "Mom's Stop the Harm" with respect to the opioid crisis and indicated that he is unaware of an opioid crisis in the Village and has not heard anything from the Health Unit to indicate an opioid problem exists within the Village.

Nancy Graves indicated that Insp. Kingsley would be taking over the position of Acting Staff Sergeant.

Good morning Doug,

Just following up from my voicemail I left with you this morning regarding your municipality's s. 10 contract for OPP policing, set to expire on December 31, 2021.

There are a few options for consideration in relation to the renewal:

- 1) Renewal of s. 10 contract – term 3, 4, 5, or 6 years (terms legislated by the Police Services Act)
- 2) Revert to s. 5.1 non-contract policing - action requires dissolving the PSB and notifying the Ministry of the Solicitor General
- 3) Sign an one-year amending agreement to the **current s. 10 contract** to extend the expiry date to December 31, 2022
  - Essentially what we would be doing is changing the dates under paragraph 26 of the current contract to show the updated expiry date.

As you can see, we have to operate under the current PSA until the new CSPA comes into force. While we have no confirmation yet, the expectation is that this is likely to occur sometime in early 2022.

In light of this, we understand completely if municipalities are not wanting to renew their s. 10 agreements for a full 3, 4, 5, or 6 year term. This is why we are offering the additional option of considering an amending agreement to extend the contract for one more year until the new CSPA comes into force.

Please note that both option 1 & 3 listed above would require a by-law.

Additionally, we won't have any 2022 billing estimates available for distribution until this coming October.

We have a bit of time to consider this, but obviously a decision should be made before Dec. 31, 2021. Please feel free to reach out anytime to further discuss, or if there are any other questions.
