Thanks in no small part to support from the Council, the Merrickville Mid-week Market last year was a great success. This year, we are following up that awesome first season with even more vendors, more music, more local goodies and a great new location. Parks Canada has granted us space at the Blockhouse Park, Merrickville's historic venue on the Rideau. We'll be showcasing local growers, crafters, bakers and artisans every Wednesday afternoon beginning May 30. Market hours are from 3pm to 6 pm.

To aid in that, the Market Committee requests that the Council provide access to electrical power from a municipal source, for the benefit of our vendors in maintaining food at safe temperatures, and also local musicians we plan to have on site.

We anticipate the current draw will be relatively small, as approximately 20% of our vendors have indicated they would access power, and the Market is only 3 hours in duration, once a week. Our estimated Approximate power usage would be less than \$100 for the season (\$0.15 per kilowatt hr x 30 KWh per market day x 20 market days = \$90.

The following is an outlined plan for the proposed signage to be used for the Mid-Week Market from May 30, 2018 to October 17, 2018.

Permanent signage for the season would be placed at the county boarder signs. Merrickville-Wolford signs coming into the town from the ingress roads (St. Lawrence Street, Hwy 43 from Smiths Falls, Hwy 15 from Burrits Rapids and Mainstreet from Kemptville). The signs would be wood keeping with the current look of the boundary signs and display the words "Merrickville Mid-Week Market, Every Wednesday from May- October" they would be placed under the "Call before you burn" signs currently posted.

An A-frame sign would be placed at town center (Corner of Main St. and St. Lawrence) on Wednesday mornings and be taken down at end of market day.

We have been granted the Blockhouse Park to host the market; we would like to hang a banner on the island separating the parking lot from Main St. every Wednesday. The sign would hang between two trees using bungee cords to support the sign and not damage the trees.

Also considering the new location we would like to request the use of St. John Street during market hours for vendors to unload their goods. The vehicles would be moved to neighboring side streets during the market hours. We ask for no parking signs to be placed on St. Johns Street or signs reading "vendor loading area" placed by town works on Wednesday mornings to accommodate our vendors needs.

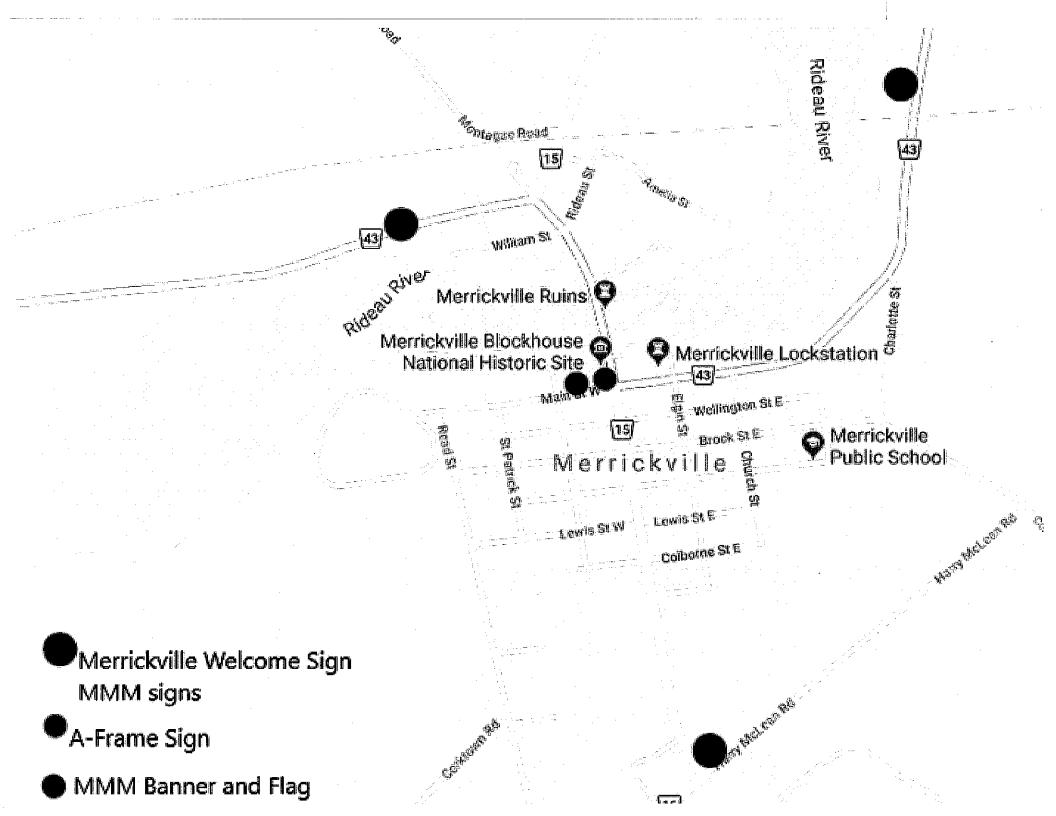

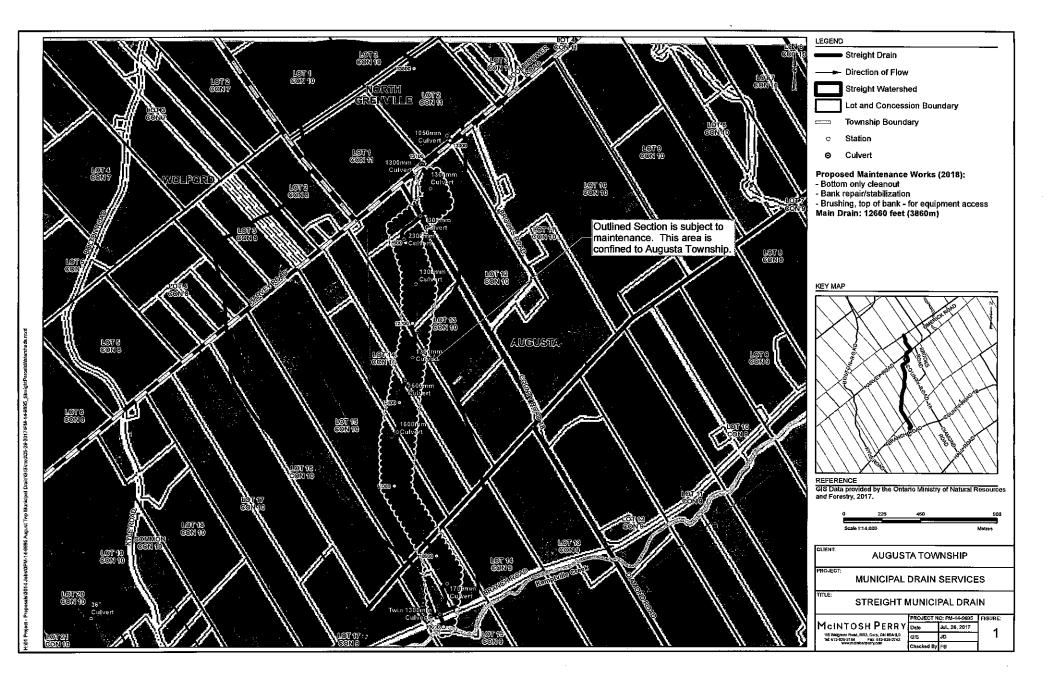

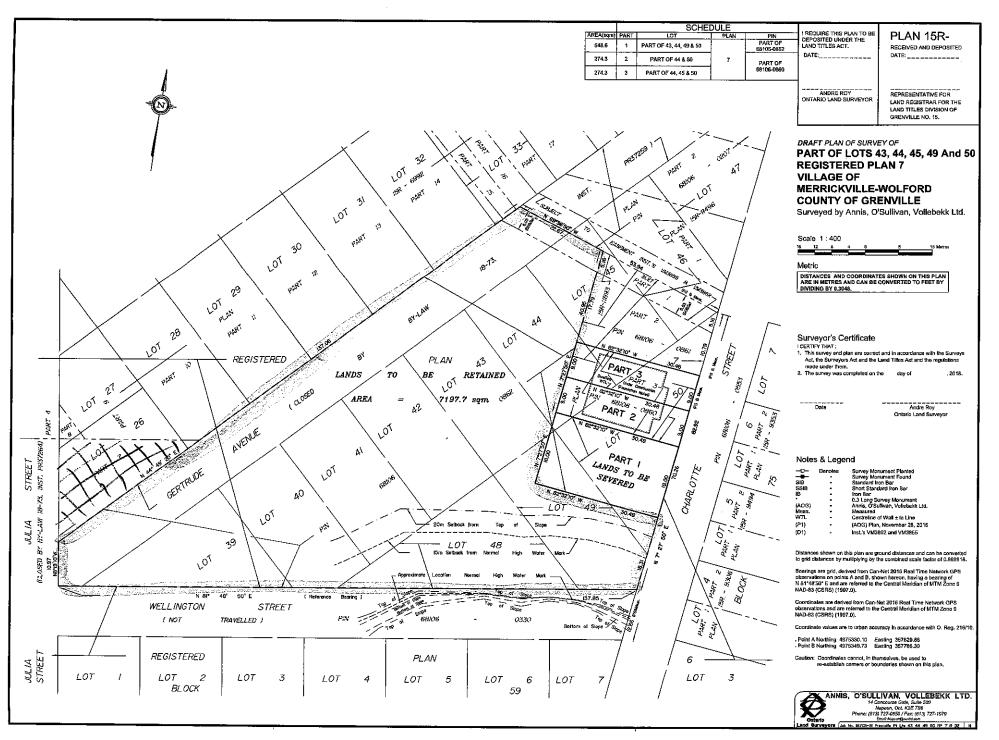

Report CAO-03-2018 of the CAO's Department Report to Council: May 28, 2018

RE: Village Staffing Changes

OBJECTIVE: To provide Council and the public with an update on the workplace investigation, staffing shortages, and financial implications.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council receive report CAO-03-2018, for information purposes; and

That the report is noted and filed.

BACKGROUND:

The Village's Manager of Finance/Treasurer position was vacated on January 11, 2018. The CAO/Clerk was placed on leave effective January 19, 2018.

On January 22nd, Nigel White was retained as Treasurer/CAO on a part-time, interim basis. On February 15th, A&B Municipal Solutions, Arie Hoogenboom, was retained as Interim CAO/Clerk/Treasurer, still on a part-time basis. In Ontario, municipalities must have a designated Treasurer and Clerk as these positions are statutory.

On February 26th, the Village Receptionist, Kathy Throop resigned. On March 22nd, Richard Bennett was retained as a part-time Treasury Assistant. On April 23rd, Kirsten Rahm and Emily Morrison commenced employment as the Manager of Finance/Treasurer and Receptionist, respectively. Both are full-time employees.

ANALYSIS:

There has been considerable turnover at the staff level. Mr. White left the employ of the Village upon my arrival because he was already working part-time for another township and felt he could not dedicate the necessary time to the Village as Treasurer and CAO. The writer of this report has worked previously for 7 months in 2016 for the Village on a similar basis and was asked to return. Mr. Bennett filled in for a short time until Ms. Rahm was hired and assisted the Village in finalizing the 2018 budget.

Council and senior staff have had to hold multiple closed sessions where we are bound by confidentiality rules. While this entire process may be frustrating for the public, it is necessary. The Interim CAO/Clerk has been delegated as the point of contact for the Village on these human resource issues.

The 2018 budget did anticipate extra costs. Through the process of managing vacancy costs, these extra costs may be partially offset.

OBJECTIVE:	To provide Council with an overview of the new flexibility for

BACKGROUND:

The province of Ontario is responding to municipalities' concerns regarding the revenue they receive in respect of high-tonnage rail lines. Beginning in 2018, municipalities can request an increase to the rates per acre for certain high-tonnage rail lines. These are identified as lines with at least 70 million gross ton-miles per route mile annually.

ANALYSIS:

The first step for municipalities wishing to utilize this increased rate is to pass a formal Council resolution, which must be submitted to the Minister of Finance on or before June 29, 2018. The Ministry will then review eligibility and determine if we meet the high-tonnage threshold.

There are two mainline railway right-of-way properties in The Village of Merrickville-Wolford that might meet the threshold. The Village currently receives \$91.05 per acre. If approved, we would receive \$300 per acre. One of the lines is 31.53 acres, and the other one is 26.45 acres.

BUDGET/LEGAL IMPLICATIONS:

There are no impacts to the 2018 Budget.

INTERDEPARTMENTAL IMPACTS:

Not applicable.

LINKS TO STRATEGIC PLANS:

On January 23, 2017, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Merrickville-Wolford passed By-Law 10-17, being a by-law to adopt the Merrickville-Wolford Strategic Plan 2017-2025.

The priorities of the strategic plan that can be linked to this report are as follows:

Fiscal Sustainability

Qualifying for a higher tonnage rate would increase PIL revenues.

CONCLUSION:

It is recommended that Council approve the Resolution requesting the Minister of Finance consider a high-tonnage rate of \$300 per acre for the high-tonnage rail lines.
